ABOUT THE NEIGHBORHOOD

Detroit Shoreway is located two miles west of downtown Cleveland, on a bluff overlooking Lake Erie.

The **Gordon Square Arts District** is the heart of the neighborhood along Detroit Ave (served by RTA's 26 bus). The district is home to six theatres – including our **Capitol Theatre** cinema – the LGBT Center, 78th Street Studios, and creative shops and restaurants.

Edgewater Park to the north hosts 147 acres of greenspace and beaches. **Michael J. Zone Recreation Center** to the south provides sports, swimming, and year-round programming. Many smaller greenspaces and community gardens are located in between.

The **Cleveland EcoVillage** is a diverse community focused on sustainability and centered around RTA's West 65th-Lorain Red Line station (which connects us to the airport, Downtown, and the east side of Cleveland).
